- 6 From the Mayor extending the appointment of James Casieri as Temporary Building Superintendent for the City of Brockton for a period of sixty (60) days.
- 7 From the DPW Commissioner requesting to expend additional funds up to an amount of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for the purpose of FY2010 snow removal in accordance with Ch. 44, Section 31D of the M.G.L.

Notwithstanding, recommending that the City Council approve the request, because some level of snow removal clearly will be needed if after the FY2010 appropriation is exhausted, additional storms occur. However, strongly urging that the DPW Commissioner and the Mayor reduce the current level of snow removal effort, which is very aggressive, for the balance of the year.
