COMMUNICATIONS:

From the Fire Chief requesting the City Council accept and expend a FY2009 Assistance to Firefighters Grant in the amount of \$229,840 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) which is 80% of the grant. The City's share is 20% or \$57,460 which was included in the FY2011 budget in anticipation for this grant. The Fire Department intends to use these grant funds to purchase new Turnout Gear for all members of the Brockton Fire Department.
12. From the Mayor recommending that the City Council authorize the acceptance and expenditure of the grant award in the amount of \$229,840 (which is 80%) from Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to Fire Department-FEMA and DHS Grant. The city share of 20% was included in the FY11 budget in anticipation of this grant.
