 4. Hearing on the request from Brockton Post #1046 Veterans of Foreign Wars – 283 North Quincy Street, to appoint Brandon S. Doherty as the manager.
 5. Hearing on the request from Frankndogs Inc. for a Common Victualer license at 708 Belmont Street.
 6. Hearing on the request from Clyde and Branden Baxter dba C & H Auto Sales to transfer the Class II Motor Vehicle Dealer license at 638 Crescent Street to Grove Street Truck and Auto Sales, Inc. at 191-193 Grove Street.
 7. Hearing on the request from Shoe City Auto Sales, Inc. to transfer the location of the Class II Used Car Dealer license from 754 Main Street to 2020 Main Street.
 8. Hearing (postponed from meeting of May 16, 2012) on the charges against Emysafari Dance Club Corp. – Christian Ekechukwu, Manager, 22-26 Perkins Avenue, of the following alleged violations reported by the local police on February 12, 2012 at 1:05 a.m.:

- (a) **Brockton License Commission Rule 8(a) (General On-Premise Licenses), to wit:** “The last drink must be served before the closing hour. All glasses and bottles must be cleared from the tables or bar by 15 minutes after the closing hour. All customers must have left the premises by 30 minutes after the closing hour. Any licensee and his employees shall not be prohibited from being upon such premises at any time for the purpose of cleaning, making emergency repairs to, or providing security for, such premises or preparing food for the day’s business or opening or closing the business in an orderly manner. They may not drink after the closing hour.
 - (b) **ABCC Rule 2.05 (2) Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit:** “Allowing Entertainment beyond the approved hours.”
9. Hearing (postponed from meeting of May 16, 2012) on the charges against Vulcan Bar, Inc. – Augusto Rosa, Manager, 705 North Montello and 48 Ames Street, of the following alleged violations reported on March 4, 2012:
 - (a) **Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission 204CMR 2.05(2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit:** “M.G.L. Chapter 138, Section 34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under 21 years of age”; and
 - (b) **Brockton License Commission Rule 8(b)(1) (All Alcoholic Restaurant)** pertaining to Holders of Licenses with a 2:00 a.m. closing hour, to wit: “No patrons are allowed admittance after 1:00 a.m. Any patron leaving the establishment, not to include patrons going outside to smoke, is not allowed to re-enter after 1:00 a.m.” “A violation . . . will result in an automatic one hour rollback of the closing hour as well as any other sanction(s) deemed appropriate.”
10. Hearing on the charge against Mardom, Inc. dba Hayden Westside Liquors – Maria Daviega, Manager, 104 Torrey Street, of the following alleged violations:
 - (a) **M.G.L. Chapter 138, Section 34, to wit:** “. . . whoever makes a sale or delivery of any such beverages to any person under twenty-one years of age, either for his or her own use”, on May 3, 2012, at approximately 6:15 p.m.;
 - (b) **M.G.L. Chapter 138, Section 34D – Failure to post notice of penalties...**
