OLD BUSINESS

COBB AVENUE

Request from Councilor Dennis DeNapoli to have “No Parking” signs installed on Cobb Avenue during the Rox games and the Brockton Fair days.

HOWARD STREET and MONTELLO STREET

Request from Councilor Dennis DeNapoli to have no turns on Howard Street at Montello Street as traffic is backing up to Winter Street; there are two lanes going north on Montello Street.

CRESCENT STREET and LYMAN STREET

Request from Councilor Dennis DeNapoli on behalf of BAMSI (Brockton Area Multi-Services, Inc.) to take a look at the crossing signal lights (pedestrian lights) at the intersection of Crescent Street and Lyman Street.

Chief Francis stated that he will take a ride there with the Signal Division to determine what is going on with the lights and he will come back to the September meeting with a report for the Commission and recommendations as to how to fix the problem.

LINCOLN STREET

Request from Councilor Dennis DeNapoli to have one hour parking signs installed on Lincoln Street.

NEW BUSINESS

SUMMER STREET and EDSON STREET

Request from Councilor Paul Studenski to have the Traffic Commission review the intersection of Summer Street and Edson Street to determine whether any corrective actions can be taken as there have been a number of accidents at this location.

EDINBORO AVENUE

Request from Councilor Jass Stewart on behalf of Roberta Carroll of Edinboro Avenue to review the possibility of posting “resident only” parking signs on Edinboro Avenue, as she is concerned about the number of utility trucks that end up parked on her street due to construction projects and NGrid.

PLEASANT STREET

Chief Francis informed the Commission members that it has come to his attention that at the intersection of Rockland Street and Pleasant Street at the house on the southeast corner of that intersection (972 Pleasant Street) that has a gathering of cars every day; at least 8 cars parked in the driveway and then 10 to 12 cars parked in the street, so that when you are trying to come out Rockland Street to turn right you cannot see the traffic coming westerly and if you edge out you are in the middle of the road for the cars coming easterly. He would request that this issue be sent to Subcommittee informally and then placed formally on the September Agenda for review and determination. Chief Francis recommended possibly placing a “No Parking Here to Corner” sign as there is no parking restriction there at the present time.

STERLING ROAD

Request from Councilor Dennis DeNapoli to have No Parking signs on Sterling Road due to a parking problem.

QUINCY AVENUE and ADAMS STREET

Request from Captain Williamson to place the issue of the Quincy Avenue and Adams Street parking problem back on the agenda. The Commission previously voted to put up signs but there is a gas line that is posing a problem so the signs cannot be installed as voted and he would like to discuss alternatives.

PARTRIDGE CIRCLE

Request from Captain Williamson on behalf of a resident of Partridge Circle to have the Traffic Commission look into placing a “jersey barrier” or something similar at the end of Old Ash Street and Partridge Circle, which would in effect make Old Ash Street a dead end.
