Expenditures from the Vacant and Abandoned Buildings Revolving Fund shall be made on the authority and direction of the Brockton Building Commissioner, provided that not more than seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) may be so expended from the Vacant and Abandoned Buildings Revolving Fund during fiscal year 2012. The Brockton Building Commissioner shall comply with the reporting requirements of M.G.L., Ch. 44, Section 53E ½.

From CFO in accordance with Section 5 of Chapter 324 of the Acts of 1990, certifying the proposed authorization of the Vacant and Abandoned Buildings Revolving Fund for FY2012, from fees and fines for registration of vacant and abandoned buildings, limited to annual expenditures of not more than \$75,000 for the closing and boarding up of vacant and abandoned buildings.
