OLD BUSINESS

NORTH QUINCY STREET AND NORTH CARY STREET

Request from Councilor Michelle Dubois for a review of the need for more traffic signals, signage and guardrails in front of certain residences at the intersection of North Quincy Street and North Cary Street due to the number of motor vehicle accidents and property damage.

NEWBURY STREET

Request from Councilor Thomas Monahan to have the Traffic Commission consider placing Stop Signs at the intersection of Newbury Street and Green Street.

PLAIN STREET at MAIN STREET

Request from Councilor Paul Studenski to review the "No Turn on Red" sign on Plain Street at Main Street to see if it can be returned to an allowed right turn on red after stopping.

WEST CHESTNUT STREET

Request from the Mayor's office on behalf of a constituent to have the Traffic Commission consider placing additional "One Way" signs on the portion of West Chestnut Street between Donald Street and Warren Avenue as there has been an increase in the frequency of cars coming out of Echo Street and traveling the wrong direction to cut over to Hardy Avenue and Lilly Avenue.

WEST ELM STREET

Request from Capt Steven Williamson on behalf of neighbor Lenny Alkins to have the Traffic Commission consider a truck restriction on West Elm St. The street is predominantly residential between West St and Warren Av. The road is heavily travelled and in poor condition.

QUINCY STREET and COURT STREET

Request by Capt. Williamson on behalf of Mary O'Connell of 2 North Quincy St, to review the intersection of Quincy Street & Court Street to come up with possible safety measures, perhaps a protective property barrier. The intersection is heavily travelled and has had numerous accidents involving damage to neighbors' property.

NEW BUSINESS

TRAFFIC COMMISSION BUDGET

Request from Fire Chief Richard Francis to have the Traffic Commission members vote to send a letter to C.F.O. John Condon requesting an increase in funding for the Traffic Commission budget.

SCHOOL STREET PARKING

Request from Parking Clerk Patricia Florio to have the Traffic Commission review the parking spaces on School Street adjacent to City Hall to see if more parking spaces can be safely added to accommodate citizens visiting City Hall.

BROOKSIDE AVENUE

Request from Councilor Dennis Eaniri to have a "No Parking" restriction on one side of the street. He has received complaints from residents of people parking on both sides of the street. The street was repaved a few weeks ago, and this street has a heavy traffic flow. It is not a very wide street. Emergency vehicles (fire) would never fit if parking is on both sides of the street.

Traffic Commission previously voted "No Parking" on the even-numbered side, but there is a gas line running along that side of the road. Placed back on the Agenda to discuss moving the "No Parking" to the odd-numbered side.

MENLO STREET and ETRICK STREET

Request from Councilor Dennis Eaniri to have the Traffic Commission review the 4 way stop intersection of Menlo Street and Etrick Street and consider if the intersection needs more signage. A recent crash at the intersection caused significant property damage to a neighbor's fence.
