### **OLD BUSINESS**

#### **THOMPSON AVENUE**

Request from Councilor Shirley Asack on behalf of David Cruise to have street signage installed on Thompson Avenue.

#### **LAWRENCE STREET and MONTELLO STREET**

Request from Councilor Dennis DeNapoli on behalf of resident, Mrs. O'Connor, to have the Traffic Commission have a pedestrian signal installed at the lights at the intersection of Lawrence Street and Montello Street.

#### **920 CRESCENT STREET**

Request from Councilor Dennis DeNapoli on behalf of resident Elaine Herman of 920 Crescent Street to have an "Autistic Child" sign installed at 920 Crescent Street (at the corner of Hall Street).

#### **HOMESITE ROAD**

Request from Officer William Healy to place 2 signs on Homesite Road that read the following:

"No Overnight Parking (12pm - 7AM) From Here to Corner". This sign would be posted in front of 43 Homesite. As you drive west on Homesite you would view the sign restriction.

"No Overnight Parking (12pm - 7AM)". This sign would be affixed on utility pole #4 which is located between 40 and 50 Homesite. As you drive east on Homesite you would view the sign restriction.

#### **FOREST STREET**

Request from Councilor Paul Studenski at the request of a resident to have "Caution – Children" signs installed on Forest Street as there have been issues with speeding on the street.

### **OAK HILL WAY**

Request from Councilor Paul Studenski on behalf of UPS to have signage and a crosswalk installed on Oak Hill Way in the vicinity of the UPS facility.

### **PACKARD STREET and MAIN STREET**

Request from Officer Antonio Randolph to have Stop Signs installed at Packard Street and Main Street.

### **FLORENCE STREET and MAIN STREET**

Request from Officer Antonio Randolph to have Stop Signs installed at Florence Street and Main Street.

### **WINTER STREET**

Request from Councilor DuBois on behalf of a City resident that crosswalks be painted and cross walk warning signs be installed at the following Winter Street intersections. The request is for the crosswalks to go over Winter Street so children can get from one side of this incredibly busy street to the other in a safe manner. At a minimum one of the top three locations must be installed.

1. Winter at the intersection with Bourne Street,
2. Winter at the intersection with Keswick Road
3. Winter at the intersection with Field Street
4. Winter at the intersection with Hermon Street.
5. Winter at the intersection with Lawton Ave.
6. Winter at Sheldon OR Andover Street.

### **FOREST AVENUE and BOUVE AVENUE – TRAFFIC SIGNALS**

Request from Deputy Fire Chief Kevin Galligan to have the Traffic Commission members address the issue of problems with the traffic signals at Forest Avenue and Bouve Avenue, as well as other city locations.

### **HILLSIDE AVENUE and SNELL STREET**

Request from Captain DiBari to have the Traffic Commission vote to place a 4-way Stop sign at Hillside Avenue and Snell Street.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

### **FIRST STREET at TRIBOU STREET**

Request from Councilor Dennis Eaniri to have a Stop sign installed on First Street at Tribou Street headed south on the right side of the street.

### **MYRTLE STREET at BLAINE STREET**

Request from Councilor Dennis Eaniri to have a Stop Sign installed on Myrtle Street and Blaine Street headed south.

### **WEST ELM STREET – RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT**

Review of the plans for the reconstruction project for West Elm Street to be discussed.

### **936 CENTER STREET**

Request from Councilor Dennis DeNapoli on behalf of resident, Tom Duranty, of 936 Center Street To have a guardrail installed in front of his home as there are too many traffic accidents causing damage to his home.
