OLD BUSINESS

MAIN STREET

Request from Robert Malley, Brockton Parking Authority, to have the Traffic Commission members review the signage on Main Street between White Avenue and Pleasant Street, in order to clarify and simplify the parking restrictions in that area. Continued from the September meeting.

Subcommittee Recommendation: Will pick a day next week in the next week (11/21/16) or so and revisit the location.

JON DRIVE/NORTH QUINCY STREET

Request from Councilor Lally to have the current school sign that is located on Jon Drive/North Quincy Street removed and replaced with a bigger "School" sign.

Subcommittee Recommendation: Place a new Brookfield sign on the northwest corner of Jon Drive.

ROCKLAND STREET

Request from Councilor Winthrop Farwell on behalf of the Forrester Family at 71 Rockland Street to have a "Caution- Autistic Child" sign placed on Rockland Street visible in both directions.

Subcommittee Recommendation: Upon proper documentation, place 1 "Autistic Child" sign across from pole #32 for northbound traffic and 1 "Autistic Child" sign on pole #34 for southbound traffic.

BELAIR STREET

Request from Councilor Shirley Asack on behalf of Maisa DeSouza to install a safety barrier in front of her home at 216 Belair Street as there have been numerous accidents that have caused damage to her fence and vehicles have entered into her front yard.

Subcommittee Recommendation: Place a 2 direction large arrow sign in front of #216 Belair Street.

SUMMER STREET

Request from Councilor Anne Beauregard to have “No Parking” signs placed in the vicinity of 95 Summer Street.

Subcommittee Recommendation: Leave as is.

NEW BUSINESS

WEST RAILROAD AVENUE AND CHURCH STREET

Request from Scott Faria from J.K. Holmgren Engineering on behalf of Ted Carman of Yumar Realty Trust and Concord Square Development for site plan showing proposed parking on West Rail Road Avenue and Church Street to support a 50 unit residential development along with commercial and retail space.

RUSSELL ROAD

Request from Councilor Anne Beauregard on behalf of Mrs. Teresa McIntosh of 3 Russell Road for an “Autistic-Child” signed posted in both directions that inform drivers of two autistic children living at this residence.

THATCHER STREET

Request from Councilor Anne Beauregard on behalf of the Owens family who reside at 222 Thatcher Street that has no sidewalk for an “Autistic-Child” signed posted in both directions and to also evaluate the safety of the trees on the street around the property line.
