Daniel Waldo Field, a prominent Brockton businessman, gave land to the City of Brockton to be forever used as a park.

The Park now contains 756 acres with a series of ponds, lakes and a wet meadow surrounded by native hard and soft woods and plants with walking paths and seven miles of paved roadway.

The Park boasts a 65 foot observation tower which, along with the flag installation at its north side, are dedicated to Brockton Veterans of the Armed Services of the United States of America.

In August 1997, Barbara R. Shinnick founded the D. W. Field Park Association, Inc. as a support group for her successful application for the nomination of D. W. Field Park to the National Register of Historic Places with its purposes to preserve and protect the Park.
